GLOUCESTER v. DEVONPORT SERVICES.

Gloucester, who proved successful over Plymouth Albion in the first match of the tour on Saturday, opposed Devonport Services at the Rectory this afternoon.

Gloucester, who were without Voyce, pressed strongly for a long period in the first half, but play, which was almost confined to the forwards, was poor.
