GLOUCESTERSHIRE WIN COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP.

In the final for the County Championship at Blundellsands, Liverpool, on Saturday, Gloucestershire beat Lancashire by 2 goals 1 try, (13 points) to 1 goal (d) 1 try (7 points). Harris, Weaver, and Gwyn Davies scored tries for Gloucestershire, and Boughton converted two.

Though deprived of the services of their two second-row forwards (Williams and Bryant), the Gloucestershire pack proved superior, and to their splendid efforts victory was made possible. J. S. Tucker (Bristol), had the distinction of captaining the winning team, and was warmly congratulated in successfully leading England and the County Champions this season.

Eight Gloucester players (Boughton, James, McCanlis, Saxby, J. Davies, Carpenter, Wadley and Comley) were included in the victorious side, and Hemming was in attendance as reserve.

This was Gloucestershire's sixth Championship success.
