

# THIRD TIME LUCKY?



Gloucester Rugby's path to the 2011 LV= Cup Final came full circle last weekend with the 45-17 victory over the Newport Gwent Dragons at Kingsholm.

The win, in front of 12,500 delirious Cherry and White supporters, clinched Gloucester's berth in the showpiece final in a campaign which got off to a less than stellar start at the home of the Dragons back in November.

On a wet and windy night in Newport, the pool opener went the way of the Dragons as Gloucester's expansive game floundered in the less than hospitable conditions and in the face of some dogged Dragons defence.

It was a setback to Gloucester's hopes of making the final of the Anglo-Welsh tournament for a third year in succession but Bryan Redpath's side didn't dwell on it for long.

Saracens were the first visitors to Kingsholm and Gloucester turned on the style to earn a tryscoring bonus point on their way to a 36-10 win.

This left Gloucester still in the hunt as the tournament went into its usual winter hibernation until its resumption in the spring.



By the time Gloucester returned to LV= Cup action, they had already bowed out of Europe at the group stages so there was a renewed focus as Gloucester travelled north to take on Leeds Carnegie.

Headingley had, of course, been the scene of a desperately disappointing New Year's Day Aviva Premiership defeat for Gloucester so there was added incentive to deliver a professional performance.

And that performance duly followed as Gloucester made it two bonus point wins in a row with a 30-16 victory which moved them into first place in the group and placed their destiny well and truly in their own hands.

London Irish came to Kingsholm looking to keep alive their faint hopes of qualification but Gloucester, by now in the middle of an excellent run of form, ran riot on their way to a 41-8 win.

This set up last weekend's semi-final showdown against the Dragons and an opportunity for Gloucester to put the record straight against the side that hijacked them in the pool stages.

A glorious afternoon at Kingsholm saw Redpath's side roared to victory by a vociferous

home crowd and Charlie Sharples was the headline grabber with a four-try salvo.

It marked Gloucester's tenth win in a row and sees the team enter today's final in excellent form and with confidence high.

It's the third time in succession that Gloucester have made the final and, hopefully, at full time, it will be third time lucky!
