Billy Twelvetrees joined Gloucester Rugby from Leicester Tigers ahead of the 2012/13 season.

The centre, who also plays at flyhalf, was chosen as vice-captain to Tom Savage for the 2013/14 season but has taken over while the big lock has been absent. Originally from Sussex, Twelvetrees joined the Tigers Academy in 2007 and had a spell at Leicester Lions as well as scoring 18 tries, 16 conversions, and 13 penalties for Bedford in 2008/09.

His form for Bedford saw him quickly recalled by the Tigers and he went on to become a first-team regular.

> d at Saxons level by England, he possesses an ideal mix of size and skill. He has a fine boot when kicking out of hand and is a more than capable goal-kicker. He earned a call-up to England's Elite Player Squad for the 2013 Six Nations, making his debut against Scotland at Twickenham and scoring a try in the process.

A mine first seasoff was reflected in his selection for ie England tour of Argentina. le scored a try in the First Test before being called up to the British and Irish Lions squad. Twelvetrees also featured in England's impressive 2014 Six Nations campaign.



THE BOSS

Director of Rugby Nigel Davies joined Gloucester Rugby as Director of Rugby in June 2012.

Davies was Head Coach at Welsh region Scarlets since June 2008.

The Llanelli-born-and-bred centre won 29 caps for his country between 1988 and 1997, before joining the Welsh national coaching set-up under Gareth Jenkins.

Davies is one of the very few Welsh players to have both coached and captained his country.

As a player of undisputed talent, he played 498 games for Llanelli, becoming one of only 21 players to have scored more than 100 tries for Scarlets, where he also played in a record nine Welsh cup finals, winning six.

He has been associated with top-flight rugby for more than 28 years as a player and then coach.

He returned to the Scarlets as Head Coach in May 2008, leading the development of the Scarlets squad, which includes the emergence onto the regional and international scene today of some of Wales' most exciting new rugby talent.

COOK LOOKING TO END ON HIGH

When Rob Cook put pen to paper to sign for the Cherry and Whites, the full-back admitted he never imagined being named as Player of the Season ahead of Dan Robson and Billy Twelvetrees.

And approaching the final game of the Aviva Premiership campaign, taking momentum into next season is deemed vital.

He said: "We look back at the games we've played against Worcester and we say it every week – there are no easy games at this level regardless of what is at stake.

"Before the London Irish game we wanted to go out and get two wins to finish the season off and go out on a high with two good performances.

"We wanted to make Kingsholm a real fortress and we haven't done that this season so we owed last week's win to the supporters.

"It was a nice sunny day and at times we played some great rugby.

"However, we have to improve on that and learn to be ruthless because when you go 17-5 up you should go on and win by more."

Cook has been a stand-out performer at full-back in his second full season in the Aviva Premiership since his move from Cornish Pirates. He's taking everything in his stride and putting his teammates first, as he develops his game at the top table of domestic rugby.

He continued: "It comes down to the team performance in the end and that has been disappointing. THEY HAVE BEEN WITH US THROUGH THICK AND THIN THIS SEASON AND AS A TEAM WE HAVE TO GO OUT AND GIVE THEM SOMETHING TO CHEER ABOUT IN THE FINAL MATCH."

But on a personal level, obviously I want to improve and develop, so I've been happy with how I've played at times. "But for me, it's always about the team and helping the team to improve." Voted as the Supporters' Player of the

B PLAYERS TO WATCH...

CHARLIE SHARPLES

A product of the Gloucester Rugby Academy, Charlie Sharples made a dramatic impact on the first-team squad in 2008/09.

He was set to represent England Under 20s against Wales but was recalled by the club and went on to make nine first-team appearances, scoring a memorable first senior try against Bath.

He was named in the England Under 20 squad for the Junior World Championship in 2009 and kicked on to enjoy a fine 2009/10 season for Gloucester.

He scored 12 tries from 18 starts (including friendlies) and was shortlisted for Try of the Year at the Guinness Premiership Awards.

The 2010/11 season was even better for Sharples as he scored 18 tries in 29 appearances, was voted Young Player of the Year by the supporters and was selected for England Saxons.

The winger was named in England's Rugby World Cup training squad in the summer, making his debut as a replacement against Wales.

The 2011/12 was another successful campaign at club level with his try-scoring tally in double figures once again and a first England start, in Paris against France.

He has since added to his England cap tally and scored his first international try against Fiji.





SIONE KALAMAFONI

Tongan international Sione Kalamafoni moved to Kingsholm from Nottingham Rugby ahead of the 2012/13 season.

Kalamafoni started three of his country's four matches in Rugby World Cup 2011 as a blindside flanker and appeared as a replacement in the fourth.

He particularly caught the eye in the memorable 19-14 victory over France

when he was named Man of the Match.

The flanker impressed in his first season at Gloucester with his powerful ball-carrying and work in defence, and was named as the Season Ticket Holders' Player of the Season.

The big back-row has been an ever-present for the Cherry Whites this season, picking up four tries along the way.

ROB COOK

Twenty-eight-year-old Rob Cook joined Gloucester from Cornish Pirates in 2012.

A prolific points-scorer in the Championship with the Pirates, he totalled over 1000 points in his three seasons at Mennaye Field.

However, to add to his goal-kicking, Cook is a dangerous counter-attacker, having

scored 26 tries in the three campaigns with the Pirates..

The 2011/12 season saw him named in the Championship Dream Team as he passed a 1000 points for the Pirates and chalked up a century of first-team appearances. Cook has starred with the boot for Gloucester this season and has crossed the whitewash six times.
