

The season so far

INCE the turn of the year, the Cherry and Whites have won eight games and drawn one out of 12


in all competitions to give the team good momentum as they approach the business end of the season.

It will, of course, be the third

time that these two teams have met in 2014/15. Both the previous encounters have taken place at Kingsholm – Quins won the Premiership clash while Gloucester won in the LV= Cup.

After the many changes in personnel during the close season, both on and off the field, the main message from Kingsholm as the





season approached was a plea for patience. Everything will take time to gel was the predominant theme.

After all, incoming Director of Rugby David Humphreys didn't take up his post until August 1st, and new Head Coach Laurie Fisher didn't arrive until after the Brumbies' Super Rugby season came to an end.

In hindsight, perhaps winning the Premiership Rugby 7s series for a second season running didn't help with the tempering of expectations!

Even then, "Judge us after the first phase of the Premiership is over" was the Gloucester mantra, even after the heavy opening night defeat at reigning champions Northampton Saints.

steadily better in all departments. Defensively in particular against Premiership opposition, the improvement has been marked. In the first half of the season, a number of games decided by small margins went against Gloucester. Recent matches have seen that trend turned.

In fact, two of Gloucester's significant Premiership victories – away at Exeter and at home to Saracens - were both won by the margin of one point. Small margins




but significant ones.

Things have been a bit more straightforward on the European front. Having won all six games in the European Rugby Challenge Cup, Gloucester qualified for the knock out stages as top seeds.

It resulted in a home quarter-final against Connacht Rugby, a tense and hard-fought encounter which ended with Gloucester digging deep to clinch a 14-7 win and earn a semi-final against Exeter Chiefs next Saturday.

It was a bruising encounter and, at the time of writing, it's not known who may miss out today at The Stoop as a result. Next weekend's semi-final is important but so is momentum going into it.

This season's LV= Cup was also a very positive experience for the club. Embracing the goals of the competition, Gloucester took the opportunity to give game time to a number of their young guns - a

few players even missed school to train – and the youngsters rose to the occasion.

The Cherry and Whites finished with three wins from their four pool games, the only defeat coming at the hands of the Exeter Chiefs at Sandy Park.

And Gloucester so very nearly won that one as well – conceding a 79th minute penalty try to lose by a point. Even then, a last minute penalty would have won it, but Aled Thomas' kick hit the post and stayed out.

For today, however, the focus is completely on the Aviva Premiership. Gloucester are currently in ninth place in the table, just a couple of points behind today's opponents.

The push is very much on in the remaining games to try and climb the table and finish as high as possible, and games like today, are crucial in that respect.

The run in begins this afternoon. Harlequins enjoyed a break from action last weekend and will also be looking to finish their season on a positive note, especially in front of their own supporters.

May the best team win.




