### DIRECTOR OF RUGBY DAVID HUMPHREYS

David Humphreys was announced as the Director of Rugby at Gloucester Rugby in June 2014.

He led Gloucester to a ninth-placed finish in his first season at the helm, before helping his side to finish one place higher last season.

Capped 72 times for his country, scoring 560 points, Humphreys spent the majority of his playing career with Ulster, before retiring in 2008 to take on the role of Director of Rugby at Ravenhill.

A qualified solicitor, his time at Ulster coincided with the province establishing itself as one of the true giants of the European rugby scene, regularly reaching the knock-out stages of the Heineken Cuplosing out in the final in 2012.

### GREIG LAIDLAW

Greig Laidlaw has been a standout performer for Scotland since making his debut in 2010 and joined the Cherry and Whites from Edinburgh Rugby ahead of the 2014/15 season.


The 30-year-old, who can play at both scrum-half and fly-half, is a top-class kicker and brings vital experience to the Gloucester Rugby squad.

Laidlaw became a regular in the Scotland team throughout the 2012 Six Nations, while captaining Edinburgh to the Heineken Cup semi-finals at the same time.

Laidlaw captained Scotland in the 2015 RBS Six Nations and also Rugby World Cup 2015. After the tournament he was shortlisted for World Rugby Player of the Year before returning to skipper Gloucester.

In his first two seasons at Kingsholm Laidlaw scored a remarkable 425 points in just 42 games.


During the 2015/16 season, Laidlaw scored 31 points in Gloucester's two European Challenge Cup games against Warriors.



### PLAYMAKER BURNS RARING TO GO

AFTER BEING HANDED THE NUMBER TEN JERSEY FOR THE SEASON OPENER AGAINST LEICESTER TIGERS, BILLY BURNS IS LOOKING TO MAKE THE MOST OF HIS OPPORTUNITY.

Ahead of the new season Billy Burns was one of many in the Gloucester Rugby squad who had been raring to go.

A knee injury suffered in March meant the young playmaker had an extended pre-season, making last Friday's return to action feel as though it had been a long time coming.

Handed the number ten shirt for the opening pair of preseason run outs and the team's Aviva Premiership opener against Leicester Tigers, Burns is determined to snatch his chance with both hands to steer the Cherry and Whites into the new campaign.

He says: "It's been really good, especially coming back from injury and getting back into things.

"Every time you get an opportunity to put the shirt on it is an opportunity to put your claim down on the shirt and hopefully I've done that."

Following injury Burns was able to get stuck into his recovery and then into the pre-season schedule.

He continues: "I haven't been around for too many pre-seasons but this summer was probably the best one I've been involved in. Everything we did in training was relevant to the 80 minutes on the pitch.

"Dan Tobin coming in and shortening the sessions, making them a lot sharper and quicker, was great and everyone put in a massive shift.

"The coaches were clear with their messaging and players were able to work on what they want us to do so we can get in and get out and get it done well."

The new season has seen Burns enter his fourth campaign in the senior set-up at Kingsholm. And


### THE 2016/17 SEASON

Some of the rugby produced by Gloucester in the first-half was simply scintillating and they will be looking to produce more of the same tonight.


David Humphreys' men will be hungry for victory as they look to achieve their ambitions of competing at the top end of the table.




