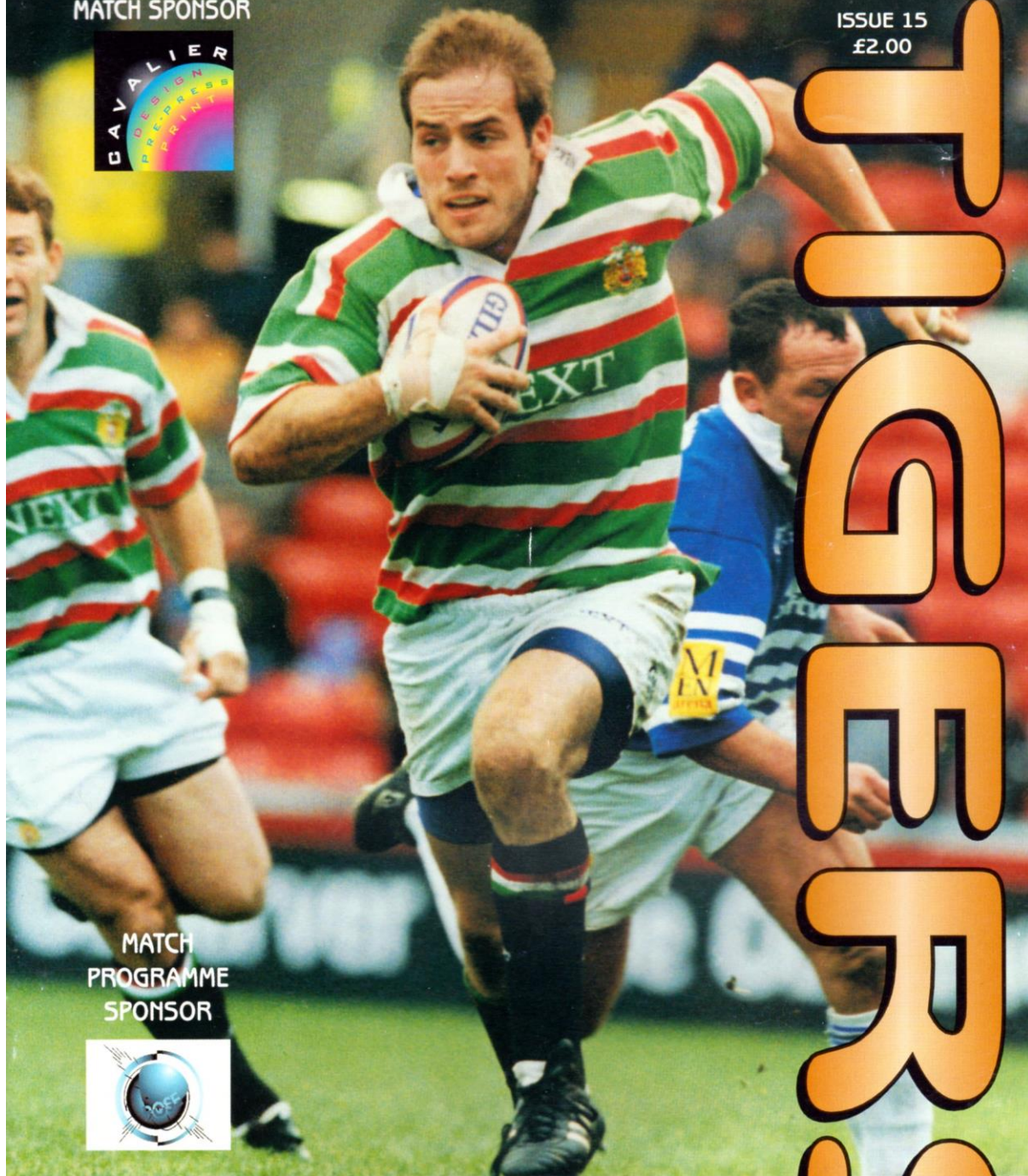

GLOUCESTER MILESTONES

1873 - The Gloucester Journal on 15 September reported that "at a meeting at the Spread Eagle Hotel for the purpose of enrolling members of a Football Club for the City about 45 gentlemen joined", thus forming Gloucester RFC.

Initially playing their home games at The Spa Ground (where Gloucestershire played 56 first-class cricket matches between 1882 and 1923) the club then moved to the Old College Field in Castle Grim. 1891 - Ground renamed, and on the 10 October, some eleven months before Leicester moved to Welford Road, Kingsholm was opened with Gloucester celebrating an 19-0 victory over Burton-upon-Trent.

1894 - In the days when the measure of a club's strength was the number of international players they had, Gloucester soon had their first representative with Walter Jackson.

1897 - Frank Stout becomes the first player capped directly from Gloucester when he plays for England v Wales at Newport

1900 - The ground was used for the England-Wales game on 16 January, and then had to wait 91 years for its second international, when New Zealand beat the United States Eagles 46-6 in the 2nd World Cup.

1972 - Gloucester become the first ever winners of the English Knockout Cup, beating Moseley 17-6 in the final at Twickenham

1984 - 2 June 1984 is a great day for Gloucester when in Port Elizabeth, South Africa the club supply the whole of England's front-row against the Springboks, but Malcolm Preedy, Steve Mills and Phil Blakeway are unable to prevent South Africa winning 33-15

1978 - Win the John Player Cup after beating Leicester 6-3 in the final

1982 - Uniquely share the John Player Cup when they draw 12-12 in the final with Moseley

1990 - Reach the Pilkington Cup final at Twickenham but are overrun by Bath 48-6. The old "Tump end" of Kingsholm is developed and replaced with Hospitality Boxes

1997 - Motor racing supremo Tom Walkinshaw buys the club and Gloucester sign overseas stars for the first time in the guise of the Saint Andre brothers, Richard Tombs and Terry Fanolua

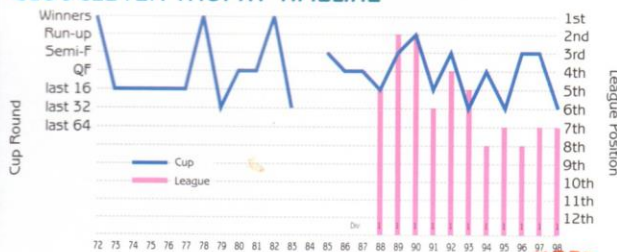
DID YOU KNOW

When Mark Mapletto scored 27 points against the Tigers at Kingsholm last February it was both the best ever league scoring performance for Gloucester AND the best by any player against Leicester in the league.

DID YOU KNOW

In the Premiership this season both Leicester and Gloucester have identical goal kicking success rates with 73.3% of their kicks going between the uprights. Harlequins and Saracens jointly top the division with 81.2% rates each.
