


Relationship between Tom Voyce Snr. & Tom Voyce Jnr.

Anthony Thomas Voyce ("Tom" Snr.)



Tom Voyce, a wing forward, is regarded by many as the father of modern wing forward play. Born in Gloucester in 1897, his progress as a rugby player was slowed by service in the First World War where he received an eye injury which impaired his vision for the rest of his life. Making his debut in senior club rugby at the age of 22, he quickly made up for lost time and within three months of the start of the 1919-20 season (the first full season after the war) he was playing in an England trial, gaining his first cap at Lansdowne Road in February. 27 England caps and a British Lions tour were to follow and at the time of his death in 1980 he was still Gloucester's most capped player. RFU president in 1960-61 and first chairman and then president of Gloucester RFC he served the club for 69 years and was truly the Grand Old Man of Gloucester Rugby.

Thomas Michael Dunstan Voyce ("Tom" Jnr.)



Tom Voyce, a full back or wing, was the great nephew of Ern Voyce. Born in Truro, Cornwall in 1981, he played junior rugby for the Penryn and Truro clubs, before joining Bath Rugby where he progressed from England Under 21 to a first full cap at the age of 20 on the 2001 tour of America. He moved to Wasps in 2003, winning eight further caps. In 2009 he joined Gloucester, making 61 appearances for the Cherry & Whites in three seasons scoring 13 tries (65 points) in all. Over his career, he made over 200 appearances in senior club rugby.
