This rugby season has been an enjoyable one for Cardiff rugby followers, and although not perhaps from mere statistics an all-time record, since in 1905-6, only one match was lost—that against New Zealand. However, this season's matches has produced a host of new records, and first and foremost comes the huge tally of points. Before to-day's game begins, Cardiff will be 30 short of 800, and it will be up to Gloucester to try and succeed where others have failed.

To-day's match is the 41st on the Cardiff fixture list and is a re-arranged fixture from February 21, when the ground was too hard to play. Gloucester have had a splendid season, and their outside-half, W. E. Jones—unfortunately engaged in a lighter battle in the adjoining cricket field and consequently not available for to-day's match—has scored well over 200 points to create a personal record. His magnificent kicking has won match after match, and he is quite the best kicker in the game to-day.

They have a splendid pack of forwards and promise to make a grand game of it and not fall into the error made by Pontypool on Saturday. All was going well until a Pontypool forward lost his head, and then trouble—real trouble started. After the match apologies were made but it was too late for 25,000 spectators had seen unpleasantness that could have been avoided so easily.


An Appreciation


