Club Notes

The visit of Gloucester to Coundon Road is a memorable one at the best of times. With the memory of last March's 6–6 draw in the R.F.U. Knockout competition still fresh, today's encounter takes on special significance.

Gloucester have started their season impressively, beating Broughton Park 14—4 last Saturday, despite having many leading players away taking part in the Harlequins seven-a-side tournament, and Moseley 31—12 on Wednesday evening.

Coventry, after their 54–17 crushing of Fylde last week, surprisingly went down 19–nil at Notts on Wednesday, and those supporters who saw the game will be hoping that the poor form of that night is just a passing phase, if you will excuse the play on words.

Both Coventry and Gloucester contributed handsomely to the England sides of last season, and two of the less well-publicised members of the clubs who went on to gain glory in South Africa were Coventry's winger, Peter Preece, and Gloucester's flanker, John Watkins.

We also expect to see the familar faces of John Bayliss (this season's Gloucester captain), Tommy Palmer, Mike Burton, Alan Brinn and Dick Smith, among others, today. An interesting newcomer to the Gloucester side is the former Cheltenham fly-half, Bob Redwood, whose advent has caused Palmer to move to centre.

Coventry's team was still not finalised when these notes were written and after the two opening games it could perhaps still be described as being in a state of flux. However if the memory of the debacle at Beeston can be forgotten, it is worth recalling that Gloucester have not won at Coundon Road in their last seven visits.

Even this early in the new campaign, the Coventry injury list already has a couple of names on it. David Cook has again dislocated his thumb, which caused him to miss the Notts match, and Richard Walker is recovering from a sprained ankle. We hope to see them both back in action soon, plus Barry Ninnes whose suspension ends shortly.

Coventry are not taking part in the Cheltenham sevens tomorrow but will be in Rugby's Centenary tournament at Webb Ellis Road on Sunday, September 17 and face Bedford in the opening round. The first game is at 12.45 and the final at 6.00.

For the benefit of those members and supporters who missed last Saturday's game, a new feature is appearing in this year's programme and can be found on the opposite page. The club are extremely grateful to those people who have already agreed to donate a match ball.


