It is unfortunate that Gloucestershire play Cornwall at Kingsholm this afternoon. As usual our visitors today supply the bulk of the players to the County side. Nevertheless, Gloucester can still bring a good side to Rodney Parade. Last year Gloucestershire won the English Counties Championship, the first time since 1937, and our visitors today won the Club Knock-out Competition, by beating Bath in the first round, Bristol in the second round, London Welsh in the Quarter Final, Coventry in the Semi-final and defeated Moseley, 17pts to 6pts in the Final. Last Saturday they went to London and beat the Harlequins 13pts to nil. Gloucester claimed the 'double' last season, winning at Kingsholm 18pts to nil and on this ground 9pts to 3pts. to 3pts.
