It is difficult to think of a more arduous yet more attractive way of commencing our home campaign than by welcoming the "John Player Cup" holders, Gloucester, to Coundon Road today. Congratulations to them on their Twickenham success over Leicester in April, we might have been there ourselves, but this factor alone will act as a further spur today to our team, should in fact they need it.

Our visitors arrive fresh from a home 33 points to 4 success last Saturday against Broughton Park. "Activity" during the close season at Kingsholm would appear to be very much a case of a senior player retiring, namely the redoubtable Mike Burton, but on the credit side, a seasoned international joining them. Lewis Dick, the former Scottish cap, has arrived in Gloucester from Swansea. During last season's successful campaign, full back Peter Butler again led the country's points scoring list with 451 points and wingers Bob Clewes and Richard Mogg between them touched down for 36 tries, 19 to Clewes, 17 to Mogg. Even not allowing for the arrival of Scotsman Dick, Gloucester certainly have plenty of wing power. Indeed with the traditional West Country forward power to go with it, we know that we are in for a very stiff encounter today.
