#### Editorial . . .

Welsh rugby fixtures have taken a battering from the arctic weather conditions to an extent unknown during the past half century. To add to our troubles we now have the prospect of industrial action at home and abroad with the TV. coverage of the French match in doubt.

This evening's game against Gloucester brings to St. Helens one of the leading clubs in the West Country. Gloucester forward power is well known and this is backed up by Peter Butler — Britain's leading scorer last season with 451 points. They also have two of England's top scoring wings Bob Clewes with 24 tries and Richard Mogg with 20.

Gloucester won the John Player Cup at Twickenham beating Leicester 6 points to 3, and again finished top of the Regional Merit Table.

As cup holders Gloucester must have been bitterly disappointed at going out of the cup competition last Saturday when they were only able to draw 3 points each at Richmond and this in spite of a storming game by former England flanker John Watkins.

Peter Kingston, Gloucester scrum half, has been selected to play for England against Ireland on Saturday. He has made a remarkable come back to the international team after losing his place in the Gloucester 1st XV last season. He gained his previous two caps on the England tour to Australia in 1975.

Swansea supporters are delighted that David Richards has been selected to play against France on Saturday. We knew it had to come sooner or later and in spite of it being at centre and not his usual outside half position we congratulate him and wish him every success in Paris. The other good news is that Geoff Wheel has recovered from his shoulder injury and is raring to go against the Frenchmen.
