Programme Notes . . .

Today's illustrious visitors have made a good but not outstanding start to this season. However, they headed their Merit Table last year and will surely prove hard opponents today. At Kingsholm last season, the Harlequins won by 20 points to 9, but it was a much closer game than that score suggests, being 6-6, in fact, at half-time.

A defeat is always a defeat, but some defeats are unlucky. So it was last Saturday, when a greatly changed 'Quins side ran Swansea so close. Indeed, our tackling and sustained determination could hardly have been bettered. Not for the first time this season, the national reports made exciting, albeit incredulous, breakfast reading. The 'Quins, it appeared, were "overwhelmed" (by 11 points to 10), the Swansea backs "once they got into their stride, were unstoppable" (scoring one highly unconvincing try), and, oddest of all, the 'Quins "come to earth with a bang when they face the big guns of Wales in *October*." To the author of this last we can only say—do please take care, sir, for we understand that a copy of your mortal prose has already reached Llanelli (September 15: remember?).

Today's 'Quins side shows 3 changes: Chris Kelly and David Bowman returning after injury, while we warmly welcome Terry Morrison back to the wing. Steve Moriarty, incidentally, has now gone up to Cambridge, where we wish him well.
