

THE VISITORS:

For our last home game this decade, we extend a warm welcome to Gloucester, once again enjoying a successful season.

On Monday of this week, our visitors became the first English club side this season to lower Bath's colours, when they triumphed at Kingsholm by 10 pts to 3, six points from Peter Butler's prolific boot ensuring a victory that must have given them immense satisfaction in a local derby. Last Saturday seven Gloucester players, Butler, Mogg, Pussell, Kingston, Sargent, Mills and Fidler were all part of the victorious county side that defeated North Midlands, whilst an eighth, Turton came on as replacement forward.

Following their game against Bath, Gloucester's record this season shows 17 wins, 2 draws and 6 defeats, with 503 points already in the bag and 249 against. During the "70's" we have met 9 times at Coundon Road, 6 of the games ending in Coventry victories, 2 to Gloucester and in 1971/72 a six all draw in the Cup competition, when of course the West Countrymen went on to win the title in the first year of its operation. Last season Gloucester gained the double over us, our last victory on home soil was two years ago, when on this corresponding Saturday, we triumphed by 16 pts to 10. We should also not forget that we have the encouragement of a 13 pts all draw at Kingsholm in September. For the benefit of the statisticians, our biggest victory was in season 1964/65, by 45 pts to nil, although Gloucester will probably be quick to point out county football was being played that day!

THE COVENTRY FRONT:

Since our last home game and the success over Bedford, results for our 1st XV have again been rather disappointing. The form shown down at Richmond was not some we shall wish to remember, in a game which overall is probably better forgotten. However to last Saturday and Llanelli, whilst we lost, the lads certainly played with character and courage and were in no way disgraced. Belated congratulations should also be extended to Jim Broderick and Huw Davies, following their appearances for Steele-Bodger's XV against Cambridge University. To Jim in particular if Huw will forgive us, may we particularly say, in the "evening" of your career, well done, a truly well deserved benous for services to the game.
