EDITORIAL

The Welsh team to play Ireland at the National Stadium tomorrow as was generally expected has been changed. Yet the extent of the changes has been dramatic. Seven players dropped and two positional changes. However we wish them all good fortune on the day.

Whilst congratulating Geoff Wheel and David Richards we sympathise with Brynmor Williams. He has shown much courage and skill in the two games he has played this season. Congratulations are also extended to Alun Donovan who joins Brynmor and Clive Williams amongst the replacements.

We extend a warm welcome this evening to Gloucester, one of the strongest teams in the West Country. Incidentally they suffered a great loss last season when Tom Voyce, the Club's most capped player with 27 caps, died at the age of 82.

Last Saturday they confirmed their supremacy over their local rivals Bath, by beating them 15 points to 10. One of the stars of the match was their international goal kicking full-back Peter Butler.

Two outstanding Gloucester three-quarters are County players Bob Clewes and Richard Mogg. Scrum-half Peter Kingston is another of their internationals, he played against Wales in 1979. Their most distinguished forward is British Lion prop Phil Blakeway who will be playing against Scotland tomorrow. Gloucester's other prop Graham Sergeant is named as a replacement against Scotland.

Second row forwards don't often get in the lime-light, they have to keep their heads down, however Barry Clegg deserves a mention for the impressive performances he has turned in recently.
