The Gloucester Football Club commenced the serious work of the season on Saturday, when they opposed the representatives of Clifton at Kingsholm. The home team was practically at full strength, and included thirteen of the players which finished up the previous season so well.

The result of the game was never in doubt, but though Gloucester emerged winners by 1 goal 3 tries (14 points) to nil, the form displayed was of quite an ordinary description.

The tries were scored by Clutterbuck (2), Frank Stout, and Stephens, and the latter kicked the goal.
