


Gloucester Spotlight



GLOUCESTER ARRIVE HERE AT THE MEMORIAL STADIUM FOR THEIR SECOND VISIT IN THREE WEEKS, **FOLLOWING THEIR CONVINCING WIN** OVER US IN THE GUINNESS PREMIERSHIP BY 41-9.

They remain unbeaten in all competitions; the closest they came to defeat was in their opening game of the season against Worcester where they drew 15-15. Other wins in the Premiership so far have been very tightly contested affairs with a three point win over Sale (Home) and a four point victory over Northampton (Away).

They kicked off their Powergen Cup campaign last week with a comfortable win over the Ospreys by 23-7, where once again Ludovic Mercier was to the fore with thirteen points from his metronomic boot, while Henry Paul and James Simpson-Daniel pitched in with a try apiece. Like a lot of coaches this side of the Bridge Dean Ryan took the opportunity in this fixture to give some of the extended squad game time. However, such is the Cherry and Whites strength in depth that the collective potency of the side was arguably undiminished.



Competition for places is extremely stiff at Kingsholm, as Rvan and his assistant Bryan Redpath fine tune their best possible line up. Hayden Thomas a shrewd signing from Exeter and Peter Richards (from Wasps) are having a battle royal at nine, while Ryan rotated his front row last week bringing in Wood, Davies and Powell for Vickery. Azam and Collazo. The back three is another area that is extremely competitive with Rob Thirlby (signed from Penzance), Simpson-Daniel, Goodridge and Foster fighting for three spots, while speedsters Marcel Garvey and James Bailey have been biding their time in the 'A' League.

A sign of Gloucester's current strength saw six of their players named in Andy Robinson's 30-Man Squad of for the Autumn Internationals, Alex Brown. an old favourite of the Bristol crowd gets a deserved call-up in the second row, while Phil Vickery, Mike Tindall and James Simpson-Daniel, three players who have had more than their fair share of bad luck with injuries, also make a welcome return. The other two spots go to another ex-Bris man Peter Richards and one of the best attacking backrowers in the land James

Captain for the season Adam Balding is not expected to return to action until November following his broken cheek bone against Worcester. In his absence Phil Vickery and Mike Tindall have both held the skipper's armband, although Tindall captains the side today. Centre/fly-half, Duncan McRae underwent knee surgery last week. The former Australian A back had some cartilage tidied up and some bone shaved off the side of his knee. He faces six weeks recovery time and will hopefully be back in action by November 12. Their highly rated young centre Jack Adams will be out of action for up to nine months after damaging his AC ligament in what has been



described as 'a freak' injury in the A game against Saracens two weeks ago, while Terry Fanolua, a linchnin at the club since 1997, is still recovering from a knee injury and is some way off a return to full fitness.

The Powergen Cup is perhaps the competition that Gloucester have the best chance of gaining qualification for next year's Heineken Cup from and no doubt they'll be determined to maintain their one hundred percent record going into today's game. Whispers were doing the rounds that they may be re-christened the Gloucester Lions in the near future, however there's no question today and for some time to come that their old faithful will stick to the simpler and more evocative -'Glawster'.
