PROGRAMME NOTES BY W. A. D. LAWRIE

This evening we extend a very warm welcome to GLOUCESTER paying their first post-war visit to the Brewery Field. We were at Kingsholm twice in 1939/40, drawing 3-3 and winning 18-13. Our last visit there was in 1965/66 with Gloucester gaining a 6-3 victory.

Mr. Alan Watkins, the Rugby Correspondent of the Gloucester Journal has been most helpful in supplying information about our visitors. Their record to date is Played 33; Won 19; Lost 13; (1 abandoned). Points for 486; points against 355. Tries for 88; against 63. 69 by backs and 29 by forwards.

Notable wins at Kingsholm this season have been against Newport 21-6; Bath 39-13; Ebbw Vale 15-11; and a "double' against Pontypool. Gloucester also ran the University XV's of Oxford and Cambridge very closely.

The Club's leading try scorers are Bob Clewes (13); Dave

Brooks (8); Gary White (7) and Roy Morris (6).

Although skipper Dick Smith and Phil Hayward are playing in the Final English Trial tomorrow, Gloucester still field a strong pack. Alan Brinn (making his 299th Club appearance tonight) and Jim Jarrett (the former Pontypool player) are both in the England squad this season, while Gary White is a former Somerset

20-year old right wing Bob Clewes, who joined Gloucester from Stroud last season has a brilliant Rugby career in front of him, with 37 tries from 65 appearances, and he played for the County against Monmouthshire. Another fine young prospect is Ex-Millfield school pupil left centre Andy Fielding, who gave a

most promising all-round display against the Wasps last Saturday. Lynchpin of the attack is outside-half Terry Hopson (he played his 300th game earlier this season), and he is a penetrative runner and shrewd tactical kicker. Left wing Roy Morris is the son of R. R. Morris, the former Wales and Swansea wing.
Gloucester's away record this season has been disappointing

so they will be anxious to do well at the Brewery Field after such a long absence and we hope they will enjoy their brief visit.

On the home scene we must offer congratulations to John Lloyd on taking his side to the top of the Welsh Club Champion-ship table for the first time this season; Llanelli 1.65 per cent behind, with Cardiff, Neath and Newport all in the running.

The fight will now be to stay at the top, with every game becoming a real "test" of concentration, courage and determina-

tion. Still, we've done it before and can do it again.

Ron Evans returns at right centre tonight, the only change behind the scrum. Gwyn Lloyd returns at hooker with Howard Evans a rota change at lock. Gordon Collier will be pleased to take up his usual flank position after a run in the centre last Saturday, with Derek Brain back in action after a spell of flood

duty in the Rhondda Valley.
