OUR VISITORS

This evening we extend a cordial welcome to our Monmouthshire friends, Pontypool with whom Gloucester have had so many enjoyable games in the past. Last season, on Saturday, December 27th, 1969, a closely-fought tussle at Kingsholm ended in victory for Gloucester over Pontypool by 12 points to 6. Wingers John Horner and Bob Clewes scored tries for Gloucester and Eric Stephens landed two penalty goals.

Pontypool met with disappointment last Saturday when they were beaten at home by Bath, though it was mainly place-kicking that enabled the Somerset club to win by 17 points to 9, for their full-back, Jim Waterman, landed three penalty goals and converted his own try.

In contrast Pontypool missed with several penalty attempts which could have brought them victory, for they also scored two tries, neither of which was converted. Seems that "Ponty", like Gloucester, have place-kicking problems!

Gloucester's defeat by neighbouring Cheltenham at the Athletic Ground last Saturday came as a bitter blow to Kingsholm supporters, especially those who travelled over to watch the game.
