Gloucester only met Newbridge once last season, at the Welfare Ground on Saturday, December 22, 1973, when they played sparkling rugby to beat the Gwent lads by 21 - 0. The last meeting between the two clubs at Kingsholm was on Saturday, October 7, 1972, when the Cherry and Whites gained victory by 24 - 10.

But on that occasion Gloucester owed much to Peter Butler, who landed four penalty goals apart from converting the two tries, scored by John Dix and Richard Jardine. No doubt our visitors have duly noted that Peter, deservedly selected for the first England trial at Rosslyn Park, is not facing them this afternoon, when we look forward to yet another enjoyable game with 'Bridge.

Enough has been written — most of it extremely hazily — about last Saturday's game at Iffley Road, where Gloucester, always appearing nonchalant until the later stages, gave probably their poorest display for several years and were deservedly beaten by Oxford University. All that needs to be emphasised is that poor John Watkins was the victim of a shocking refereeing decision.

He committed no 'crime' whatsoever, and those in the stand and Press box saw the incident far more clearly than the referee, who was not up with the play. The match had many tetchy moments, but it need hardly be said that the Dark Blues were not without their 'sinners'.

The first monthly draw of the 250 Club was made in the Social Club last weekend and among good-natured 'jeers' and considerable good-natured banter it was announced that the first prize of £25 was won by Mrs. Pat Voyce, wife of our club President, with membership ticket No. 233. The next home match is the attractive fixture with Coventry on Saturday, December 14, with the usual 3.00 p.m. kick-off.
