Our first English visitors of the season are Gloucester and to them we extend a very warm welcome. However, Gloucester have already played at Pontypridd, Newbridge and Llanelli and entertained Maesteg and Glamorgan Wanderers at Kingsholm. Of these opponents, they beat Maesteg and Glamorgan Wanderers and lost to Pontypridd, Newbridge and Llanelli.

Gloucester's full playing record this season reads:- P11 W6 F5 Pts for 170, against 146.

Our visitors are busy re-building their team at the moment but appear to be somewhat hampered by injuries. For example, England international Phil Blakeway has not yet played this season.

No doubt, Gloucester will soon sort out their problems and under the guidance of skipper John Orwin will be playing as well as ever.

During England's tour of South Africa last summer, the Gloucester club emulated Pontypool by providing the entire front row for an international game, Malcolm Preedy, Steve Mills and Phil Blakeway. However it appeared that they had to carry the can for England's defeat in the first test because they were dropped for the second, but that made no difference as England also lost that game. Lock, Steve Boyle is Gloucester's other international while No. 8 Mike Teague also toured South Africa and could make the England team this season.

Goal-kicking is not one of Gloucester's strongest points at the moment with many chances going astray. In this department, Gloucester have tried their three full backs, Peter Wickenden, who is their leading scorer, Paul Ford and Tim Smith.

County players in the Gloucester ranks include skipper John Orwin, Paul Taylor, Richard Mogg, John Gadd and the highly promising wing Andy Richards who got a fine brace of tries in the 22-10 victory over Bedford last Saturday.
