GLO'STER WIN BY 11 POINTS

BRISTOL FAIL TO SCORE IN EXCITING GAME

The match between Bristol and Gloucester at Bristol to-day was watched by 5,000 spectators.

The game produced some close and exciting play. Early on, Bristol were penalised, and PARKER, from 40 yards range, kicked a beautiful goal.

In subsequent play Bristol were hard pressed, and from a punt by Fifield Pattern fumbled and Williams, being on the spot, gathered and passed to FIFIELD, who went over with an easy try. Parker failed to convert.

Some stirring play was seen in the second half, and the game so far had served to emphasise Gloucester's advantage at forward, especially in the scrums.

Gloucester continued to hold the upper hand, and Bristol saved luckily on two or three occasions.
