GLOUCESTER v. CARDIFF

"MATCH OF THE SEASON" AT KINGSHOLM

FAMOUS INTERNATIONALS IN WELSH TEAM

Gloucester anticipate a record crowd for the season at Kingsholm tomorrow for the visit of the famous Cardiff team.

The City will be greatly strengthened in the back division for this attractive match. The inclusion of C. C. Tanner and E. L. Phillips at three-quarter will give increased confidence, and add appreciably to the attack and defence.

The Gloucester forwards, on form, should be fully equal to the task of holding the opposition, and if the desired co-operation and support is forthcoming from the backs a splendid contest is certain.

Cardiff are fielding their strongest Fifteen, and the appearance of Cliff Jones and Wilfred Wooller in the team should draw all Rugby followers to the City club's headquarters.

Since joining the Welsh Metropolitans the Internationals have transformed the side, and their brilliant work has contributed to notable victories. It will be Jones' first appearance at Kingsholm, but Wooller assisted Sale against Gloucester in a match two seasons ago.

The kick-off is fixed for 3.15 p.m., and the gates will be opened at 2 o'clock.
