GLO'STER'S SECOND HALF SPURT

FINE DISPLAY AGAINST CARDIFF

Gloucester and Cardiff were at full strength for their encounter at Kingsholm, the Welshmen including Wooller and Cliff Jones. The Rev. C. C. Tanner reappeared on the right-wing, for Gloucester.

Gloucester set up hot pressure and Stone saved in thrilling fashion.

Welshman crossed in a forward melee but a scrum outside was ordered.

Welsh was injured but resumed later.

Phillips broke through and punted ahead, but missed the ball on the bounce, and Cardiff escaped.

Edwards next got through, and again Gloucester were unlucky not to score. When Cardiff attacked Cliff Jones went clean through, but was well checked by Parker.

PARKER later kicked a fine penalty goal from outside the 25-line.

WOOLER scored for Cardiff after a brilliant three-quarter movement, but Stone's kick failed.

HALF-TIME :

Gloucester were on their toes and were giving their best display of the season. Then against the run of the play, Cliff Jones cut away and EDWARDS, deceiving scored a fine try, wide out for Cardiff, which was unconverted.

PARKER put Gloucester on level terms with a penalty goal kicked from 40 yards range, then MEADOWS dropped a smart goal to give the City the lead.

A brilliant run started by Meadows on the Gloucester 25 ended in TANNER sprinting over in the corner, Parker just missing.

In a forward scramble CARTER scored for Cardiff, but Stone missed the kick.
