SPECTACULAR TRY AFTER CLEVER PLAY

Injuries weakened the Gloucester side for their encounter at Kingsholm to-day with Llanelly, who were without W. Clements, playing for Wales at Belfast.

Gloucester were the first to try passing but Meadows' punt ahead was well fielded by Brown, who kicked beautifully to touch.

A minute later from 40 yards, Brown essayed a drop kick which fell just short. Gloucester got well down by clever kicking by Roy James and from Parker, too, came some brilliant kicking.

Warr had hard luck with a long kick at goal from a mark. Neither side had displayed much constructive football, and although Gloucester had the ball from the majority of the scrums the threes showed little penetrative power.

Gloucester took the lead when PARKER kicked an easy penalty goal.

A beautiful Gloucester try came when Roy James intercepted to pass to Hook who gave WARR an easy run in under the post. Parker converted.
