## WHITE IS GLO'STER'S 'LOCK' AT STROUD

The problem of what to do about Garry White, the brilliant Gloucester wing forward who was last season's top scorer may be near solution.

Tomorrow, flanked by the two County wing forwards, Peter Ford and Dick Smith, White will move to lock in the away match with Stroud.

White got his chance to appear in the premier side during the latter part of last season when regular wing forward Smith was injured.

It was felt that he was too good to leave out of the team but last Saturday's match against Neath revealed that both Ford and now-fit Smith were both on top premier side form.

With lock Dave Owen unfit the selectors were given the chance to try him in Owen's position, because the club's other lock, Tony Davies, was also unfit.

Scottish international wing forward David Gilbert-Smith, a somewhat similar player to White also appeared at lock for Gloucester.

Apart from White there is no other change from the team which lost by six points to nil to Neath.
