SCHOOLBOY 'CAP' LOCK FORWARD FOR UNITED

Charles Hannaford, the Crypt schoolboy who won an England schoolboy 'cap' this season, has been selected for the Gloucester United team which meets Cardiff Athletic at Kingsholm tomorrow (kick-off 3.15).

Hannaford is a younger brother of burly three-quarter Bob Hannaford who has turned out for United several times in the past. He fills the lock-forward berth, and will be packing down in the back row of the scrum between United skipper Peter Hawker and Dave Owen.

United's regular fly half David Ainge, who kicked 10 points against Bargoed last weekend, is also included in the side and Peter Meadows has again been called upon to step in from the wing to play in the centre.
