GLOUCESTER CLOUCESTER RUGBY

Gloucester were the first English club to book a place in next season's Heineken Cup, thanks to a 34-7 victory over Newcastle Falcons in the LV= Cup Final last month.



After defeats in each of the two previous finals, Gloucester were able to pop the champagne corks on their first silverware since the European Challenge Cup in 2006 with tries from Tom Voyce, Eliota Fuimaono-Sapolu, Darren Dawidiuk and Charlie Sharples plus 14 points from Nicky Robinson.

"The players should be happy about winning something because we set our sights to get as high as we can in the Premiership and win a competition," said head coach Bryan Redpath. "Now the challenge is to push on in the Premiership and make sure we keep growing as a side."

Former Leicester Tigers forwards Jim Hamilton and Brett Deacon make their first return to Welford Road with Gloucester this afternoon.

Scotland international second-rower Hamilton enjoyed two seasons with Edinburgh before returning to Premiership rugby this season, while Deacon played more than 100 games in seven years with the first-team squad here before moving to Kingsholm last summer.

Brett, unfortunately, suffered an injury during the first half of our first meeting of the season down at Kingsholm but has played more than a dozen times for Gloucester this season and is no doubt looking forward to meeting up with older brother Louis and the rest of the family this weekend.





Tim Taylor is the third former Tiger in the Gloucester ranks, coming through the Academy here and playing in New Zealand for a spell before moving to Nottingham and switching to Kingsholm initially as a short-term signing during last season.

Ingland international wing Tom Voyce made his 200th Premiership appearance in the 36-31 defeat to Sale Sharks last weekend. The former Bath and Wasps player is fourth in the Premiership all-time list of try-scorers with 62 to his name.

Anumber of youngsters have been making a name for themselves at Gloucester this season, with 20-year-old fly-half Freddie Burns contributing more than 120 points and 21-year-old Charlie Sharples adding 14 tries, including four in one cup game against Newport Gwent Dragons.

Jonny May, 21, and Henry Trinder, 22 earlier this week, are among the others making the most of their opportunities in senior company. At the other end of the age scale, former France A prop Pierre Capdevielle celebrated his 37th birthday last month and front-row colleague Olivier Azam, who is approaching 250 appearances for Gloucester, is just six months younger.

Club captain Mike Tindall, one of the survivors of England's Rugby World Cup win in 2003, has been sidelined since suffering an ankle injury in the Six Nations match against Scotland in February. He has had surgery to repair ligament damage and is expected to be out of action for 12 weeks.

Already planning for next season, Gloucester have added to their front-row options with the announcement that props Dario Chistolini and Dan Murphy will be moving to Kingsholm in the summer.

The 22-year-old South African-born Chistolini is currently with Petrarca and has been capped at Italy A level, while Murphy has made more than 70 appearances for London Irish.
