

s we move into 2006, the Gloucester fans will be pleased that their beloved team are starting to rediscover some of the form that has made them such a consistent performer in the Premiership in recent seasons.

After missing out to Saracens in the Wildcard Final on a place in the Heineken Cup, the club parted company with Director of Rugby Nigel Melville with Dean Ryan taking over the reigns.


One area that was looked back on with much discussion last season was the goalkicking. Without Henry Paul for much of the season run-in, Gloucester turned to Duncan McRae but the Australian never found the consistency that was needed each week despite giving it his best shot, the former Saracen has now taken up a coaching role at the club.

This season the West Country club have now solved their kicking problems with former favourite Ludovic Mercier returning to Kingsholm after his sojourn in Pau.

The other big-name signing to arrive in the close season, although he didn't have far to travel, was centre Mike Tindall.

Peter Richards made the move from Wasps and he can operate anywhere in the backline and Patrice Collazo adds some power at prop to an already impressive from row.

Early season form saw the Kingsholm outfit near the top of the Guinness Premiership table with only one defeat in their opening four matches, mixed form since then sees them operate a mid-table spot in the league just above Saracens, but with Mercier and Tindall returning to form and the likes of James Forrester and Adam Balding starting top earn international honours, the future looks bright.

The 24-year-old number eight is a regular try scorer from the base of the scrum after scoring a number of hat-tricks over the last couple of seasons. His last two seasons have been interrupted through injury with an elbow operation in 02/03 followed by a dislocated shoulder in 03/04. Again blighted by injury last season to his wrist and ankle, Forrester was named in England's 45-man elite player squad for the first time this season.

Simpson-Daniel joined Gloucester from Sedbergh School and has established himself at home on either the wing or in the centres. His Gloucester debut was against Rotherham in 2001 when he scored a superb individual try. He has gone on to make an impression at international level and his first England try came against Italy in the Six Nations in 2003 and he played in the opening game against New Zealand on the tour of 2004.


Hazell made his Gloucester debut during the 1997/98 season and established himself as a regular in the back row. Injuries have hampered his appearances both in the 2002/03 season and to some extent during the 2003/04 campaign, but he was a member of the England squad that toured for the Churchill Cup in the summer of 2004. A powerful and quick runner, he is also a strong tackler.



Peter Richards



Scrum-half Richards played the majority of last season in the centre for his former club Wasps and joined Gloucester on a two-year contract. The 27-year-old was a member of England's Churchill Cup squad and moved to Kingsholm to replace Andy Gomarsall. Richards has made 89 Premiership appearances and joined Wasps in the summer of 2003 after leaving relegated Bristol, and has represented England at various levels up to England 'A' and England Sevens.







Gloucester Memories

he first time
Saracens played
Gloucester was 1968
when the two sides
met at Kingsholm,
certainly one of the most
daunting grounds in England,
for the first time.

Playing in front of the vociferous crowd, especially the famous 'Shed', and in typical wet West Country conditions Saracens did well to battle it out to a 3-3 draw but little did the visitors know that they would have to wait for another 36 years before their first victory at the home of rugby in Gloucestershire.

Several of the side on that opening day, Roger Weaver, George Sherriff, John Lockwood, and Geoff Hunt, are still involved with the club - but none of them can recall the game in detail. However Roger does recall having to buy some new studs for his boots in a sports shop in Gloucester on the morning of the game due to the heavy conditions!

It must be admitted that Gloucester have usually had the edge over Saracens in the years past but there have nevertheless been some memorable matches. In 1988 when in Courage National League Division 2 Saracens lost away 26-25. Then in 1989 in Division 1, the Men in Black visited Kingsholm again and were down 17 pts to 6 at half time.

However in the second half Saracens staged a massive fight back with tries from John Buckton, Sean Robinson and Ben Clarke. The draw was secured by Saracens' full back Andy Kennedy with his third conversion.

As **Richard Andrews** one of Saracens props remembers it: "I will never forget how quiet it went at Kingsholm! A great feeling, if you were wearing black."

In 1996 Saracens won a vital home match 19 - 16 thanks to Andy Lee's kicking - four out of four - and a David Gregory try - but lost the return at Kingsholm when the Gloucester pack ground out a 17 - 10 victory.

This was the last season before professionalism and Saracens future depended on a decision as to whether the First Division for the following season would be twelve or ten clubs.

Fortunately the decision went in favour of twelve!

In 1997 the first year of the Premiership Saracens scored a famous victory at home 42 – 24 thanks to tries by Greg Botterman, George Chuter, Michael Lynagh (who was in accurate kicking form), Phillipe Sella and Paul Wallace. However Saracens lost one of only three games during that season when

they traveled to Kingsholm as they crashed 36-15.

Since the move to Watford Saracens have only lost twice to Gloucester at Vicarage Road and last season they managed their first ever victory at Kingsholm.

The closest they had come to victory after the draw back in 1968 was a narrow 16-15 loss in 2000 where two Paul Wallace tries and kicks from Duncan McRae weren't enough to topple them but in 2005, with McRae now wearing the Cherry and White jersey, Saracens reversed their fortunes with a reverse winning 13-14 thanks to tries from Ben Johnston and Nicky Little.
