If this Guinness Premiership season promises to be one of the most open for years, then the advance of Gloucester should be one of its most intriguing aspects over the next nine months.

For those people who inhabit Kingsholm's dark depths on a regular basis, last season's late surge masterminded by a host of young backs came as quite a culture shock, but times are changing in one of the game's most respected environments.

Suddenly, names like
Anthony Allen, Ryan Lamb,
Olly Morgan, Mark Foster
and James Simpson-Daniel
were the first on the lips of
supporters who were used
to watching home-town
forwards make a regular mess
of all-comers to Castle Grim.

Gloucester's new-found freedom, partly orchestrated by design and partly by necessity, ended in triumph with the European Challenge Cup against London Irish. But by then, the wheels were already in motion for this campaign.

Under the stewardship of head coach Dean Ryan, Italian duo Marco Bortolami and Carlos Nieto joined from Narbonne and Viadana respectively in two of the highest profile signings of the close season. Bortolami has already shown what a natural leader and outstanding

forward he is in the making by leading Gloucester to victory over Bath last Saturday.

Christian Califano, once voted in the all-time best French front row, switched from Agen and has been a revelation – offering immediate set-piece quality and a perfect learning base for youngster Jack Forster.

There have been other additions too. With Lamb out of action with an ankle injury, Willie Walker has taken his opportunity in the number 10 shirt, while both scrum-



half Rory Lawson and lock Will James have the potential to make serious impacts.

lain Balshaw completed the summer recruitment drive from Leeds and can be deployed from either wing or full back. It has meant that Ryan's biggest job in preseason has been managing the vast expectation on his squad.

Gloucester have been tipped to challenge the dominance of champions Sale, Leicester and Wasps but Ryan has been meticulous in not stoking the fires too much.


"Our ambition is to be at the top end of Europe but our journey has only just begun," Ryan has said. "There will be some pain along the way but we have an exciting and developing group of players who all work tremendously hard to try and be successful. We are on a journey together and there is a long way to go."

Gloucester's 24-19 victory over Bath last weekend came courtesy of tries from Jack Adams and Morgan to set Gloucester up in perfect heart for today's extremely tough test at the Twickenham Stoop.

lain Balshaw

lain Balshaw made the switch to Gloucester this summer from Leeds Tykes whom he joined in 2004, having spent seven years at Bath prior to this. Before the start of this season, he had made 106 Premiership appearances for Bath and Leeds scoring 38 tries.

He has won 24 caps for England, making his debut during the 1999/2000 season. Balshaw was part of the World Cup winning squad in 2003, where he came on as a replacement in the final victory over Australia. He was also part of the British & Irish Lions squad that toured Australia in 2001.

Christian Califano

Christian Califano joined
Gloucester on a two-year contract
from French club side Agen over
the summer. He had a year in
the Premiership with Saracens
over the 2002/03 season, having
played for Toulouse prior to this
with whom he won the inaugural
Heineken Cup in 1996.

Califano made his France debut in 1994 against New Zealand and won the last of his 68 caps in 2003 against Ireland in the Six Nations. The tight-head prop, equally at home at loose-head, has made a name for himself as being one of the most destructive scrummagers in the business.



James Forrester

James Forrester signed a new three-year contract with Gloucester back in the summer of 2004 and scored the match winning try in the 36-34 victory over London Irish in the European Challenge Cup final at the end of last season. Going into this season, he had scored 24 tries having played 54 Premiership games for the Cherry and Whites.

Played for England in their annual end of season fixture against the Barbarians back in May, but a shoulder injury forced him to withdraw from the England Saxons squad that competed in the Churchill Cup.



Mike Tindall

Mike Tindall joined Gloucester on a three-year contract last summer, thus ending his eight year stay at west country rivals Bath. He made 23 appearances for the club last season, scoring three tries in the Cherry and Whites successful European Challenge Cup campaign.

Tindall has won 49 caps for England, making his debut against Ireland in the 2000 Six Nations Championship. A crucial member of the 2003 World Cup winning squad, Tindall featured in every game bar one and scored a try against Georgia in the opening pool match of the tournament.


