Last season's losing Guinness Premiership finalists have made almost the perfect start to the season with three wins from three – and with two bonus points.




Following their defeat at Twickenham in May, Gloucester head coach Dean Ryan moved heaven and earth to strengthen what was already a tremendously-gifted squad.

While the likes of the brilliantly precocious Ryan Lamb, the rapidly emerging Anthony Allen and England international full-back Olly Morgan had another season under their belts, heavyweights arrived in numbers.

Lesley Vainikolo, the tryhunting giant from Bradford's rugby league club, was the most high-profile arrival alongside the likes of Scotland international Chris Paterson, Wallabies hooker Jeremy Paul and Fiji back-rower Akapusi Qera.

There have been other additions too. Alasdair Strokosch is a tackle-hungry, workaholic back-row forward, Leon Lloyd made the switch from the Tigers after a decade at Welford Road and Andy Titterrell has added versatility to the hooking options. All three have made definitive contributions already.

Gloucester got up and running with successive away games against Leeds Carnegie and Saracens as the finishing touches to the new C&G Grandstand were being put to Kingsholm's summer redevelopment.


Vainikolo announced his arrival in the Guinness Premiership with a debut record of five tries at Headingley as Gloucester ran riot in the second half to claim a 49-24 victory with eight tries in all.

"Some of the tries were very special," said coach Ryan. "Lesley was on the end of some good attacking play and scored some tries which any winger could have scored. But the one try he scored straight from the kick-off was pure Lesley. He was happy with that and I am happy for him.

"Simply by being on the field, he creates space for others. I thought Anthony Allen had one of his best-ever games thanks to the space created by Lesley. I'm delighted for him."



with a hard-earned victory away to Saracens that put them under greater scrutiny.

Although Vainikolo suffered a neck injury during the game and missed last weekend's win over Worcester, Gloucester plundered tries from Allen, Lamb, Morgan and back-rower Luke Narraway to record a 38-31 victory.

It gave them maximum points after two rounds and last week they opened up at Kingsholm with a 29-7 success over neighbours Worcester Warriors.

It was, though, tougher than the scoreline suggests. Worcester attacked the set-piece and attempted to be a threat in the wide channels. But, thanks to a brilliant individual try from James Simpson-Daniel, a punishing drive and score from hooker Olivier Azam and

a returning try from England's Mike Tindall, Gloucester eased to victory in front of almost 16,000 supporters.

"That was the toughest contest we have had so far," Ryan said of last Saturday's win. "Worcester had a slightly different approach from what we've seen from them in the past and they're playing with a lot more ambition.

"Worcester were very robust in defence and we just needed something to break to build from. Ironically it came off of a mistake by them which allowed Sinbad (Simpson-Daniel) to run in from 60 metres. That changes the dynamic of the second half and freed the game up a little."

Now something has to give, with Leicester and Gloucester both chasing their fourth successive win. It should be some game.
