HUDSON, ARTHUR, GORDON Height 6 ft. 1 in Weight 13 st. 12 lbs. School football in Crypt School XV. Local football, Old Cryptians: position, forward. Gloucester United 1936-37. Gloucester First XV. in 1938-39, gaining First XV. cap. Joined R. A. F. 1940. Played in all R. A. F. Service Matches 1942-45, when demobilised. R. A. F. v. French Services in Paris 1944, 1943-45 played in Services International Matches, scoring four tries v. Scottish Services (a representative match record for a forward) at Murrayfield, Feb. 1944. Played for U. K. Team v. Dominions at Leicester, 1944. Barbarians 1944-45. Major Stanley's XV 1944-45. Played for England v. New Zealand Touring Team, 1945. County Cap this season. His effective wing-forward play has produced for him many tries this year, and his form is worth the International Selectors' notice.
