# Saturday, January 19th - Gloucester United v. Hereford

We extend a hearty welcome to-day to our old friends and doughty opponents, Leicester – the 'Tigers'. The links between our clubs have been forged on the field and off. Francis Edwards, who played many games for Gloucester is on the Leicester Committee; and an old friend of ours, John Taylor, is a member of the club. Leicester are not having one of their best seasons but can provide formidable opposition. It must be remembered that after Gloucester had defeated Coventry and Newport on successive weeks away from home they fell to Leicester by 8 pts to 14. Nevertheless we can assure them that the Cherry and Whites are determined to reverse that verdict to-day.

So far this season Leicester have drawn with Bucharest, Cambridge University, Northampton and Bath, and have been defeated by Bristol, Cheltenham, Coventry, Harlequins and Newport, of the clubs on our fixture list. Although the 'Tigers' have gained only five victories at Kingsholm since the ground was opened in 1891, many of the games have produced thrilling finishes and high scoring by both sides, such as Gloucester's 18 16 win in 1948-49 and our victory at home last year by 22–11. Gloucester's best performance was in 1933-34 when they won 35-7 at Kingsholm; Leicester replied to this in the away fixture the next season by scoring 27 pts to nil.

Whilst the 1st XV is engaged in London the United will be entertaining Hereford, whom they have already beaten 11-6 away earlier this season. They will be eager to achieve the "double".
