- A On a sad note, it is with regret that we record the death of our old friend, L. E. Saxby. 'Sax' as he was known to us all, joined the Club in 1926, and had the distinction of being elected Captain for the following years: 1927-28, 1928-29, 1929-30 and 1931-32. Truly a remarkable record, but one which can be easily understood when you realise what a great sportsman he was. 'Sax' played for England in 1932 against South Africa and Wales.
