Those who took the trouble to come to Kingsholm on Monday evening were well rewarded by the best game seen at Kingsholm this Season. The North Gloucester Combination fielded a very strong side and although the United side managed to score three tries to nil there was very little in it on the run of the play and as already mentioned the general opinion of the spectators was that it was an exceedingly good game played in the best of spirits.

Tonight we have our friends from Cheltenham and it is interesting to note that we commenced playing our neighbours in the Season 1896/7 and for those interested appended is the record of matches played etc. Played 111, Won 86, Drawn 12, Lost 13. Points for 1,235, Against 358. On 43 occasions Cheltenham failed to register any points.

Supporters and others are reminded that the United side will be playing against Bristol United on Saturday next and those who had the pleasure of seeing the corresponding match last Season will surely make up their mind to come to Kingsholm and see whether the Bristol boys can manage to take their revenge for the drubbing they received. The game against the North Gloucester Combination should convince them that they will witness a throughly good game and we confidently look forward to seeing a record gate for the United teams.
