A familiar figure missing from the Coventry side this afternoon is George Cole, their scrum-half and prolific goal kicker. We wish him a speedy recovery from his injury – as, indeed, do Warwickshire, who felt his absence last week when they lost their opening County Championship game to East Midlands.
