The last occasion on which the teams met at Kingsholm was on Saturday, January 23rd, 1965, when Gloucester defeated the University by 20 points to 8. Tries came from John Bayliss and Terry Hopson, who also dropped a goal, with Don Rutherford making one conversion and landing three penalty goals.

It is good to see John Bayliss back in action again, and we all hope his knee stands up to the test in his game for the United against Newbury this afternoon.

Last weekend's match against Wasps at their Repton Avenue ground, Sudbury, was played in shocking conditions. The wind howled down from the one open side of the pitch, while the "glue pot" pitch was quite the worst Gloucester have played on this season. In the circumstances, of course, constructive rugger was virtually impossible.
