OUR VISITORS

A word on the final, incidentally, would not come amiss. Rugby enthusiasts—and those normally less fervent—are requesting stand tickets. These, to use the old saying, are like gold, particularly as Surrey can demand half those available, and members, in all fairness, must be first served.
