After next Saturday's journey to London to meet Richmond at the Athletic Ground, all Gloucester's remaining week-end matches this season will be at Kingsholm, except, of course, for the annual tour at the end of next month, when Penzance and Newlyn, then Plymouth Albion, will provide the opposition.

It should be duly noted, however, that the home match with Newport will be played on the evening of Friday, March 26th, instead of the usual Saturday afternoon. This, of course, is because both England and Wales will be engaged in international matches on Saturday, March 27th.

There's no harm in a little "plug" for our good neighbours and friends, Cheltenham, who have brought off some remarkable victories this season, including the defeat of Coventry at Coundon Road last week by a decisive margin. Gloucester enthusiasts, therefore, whose thirst for rugger is difficult to assuage, may like to be reminded that Cheltenham meet Newbridge at the Athletic Ground tomorrow night, (kick-off 7 p.m.).
