COVENTRY'S CHANGES FOR KINGSHOLM

Coventry, who are so far unbeaten by any English club this season and have lost only two matches, make changes in the threequarter line for tomorrow's visit to Kingsholm.

In addition wing forward Ray Batstone, taking part in the final England trial, had to be replaced.

The former England full back, Ted Hewitt, is still unfit and his place continues to be filled by Peter Mottram, a younger brother of Tony Mottram, the tennis star.

On the wing, Harold Greasley returns after injury, J. Mauchlen is preferred at left centre to 18-years-old George Long and the other centre is Charles Dupenois. David Palmer, normally a centre, has his first game on the wing.

Denis Heath replaces Batstone.
