LOCAL EVENTS

The City team in a much weakened state put up a glorious fight at Abertillery, and retired beaten but not disgraced by 3 tries (9 points) to 1 try (3 points). Tom Voyce was the Gloucester scorer.

This match concluded the City's season, and their record reads : Played 33, won 19, lost 12, drawn 2; for, 42 goals, 63 tries – 384 points; against, 21 goals, 43 tries – 222 points. The win of the season was that against the conquerors of Newport (Swansea) by a try to nothing, whilst the biggest defeat was suffered at the hands of Llanelly to the tune of 29 points to 5 points.

All things considered the season has been a good one for the City. The end of the season matches were taken advantage of to play youngsters and generally to indulge in team building for next season. The only trouble seems to be in the making of a forceful threequarter line, and here the Committee of the Club have a big task in front of them.
