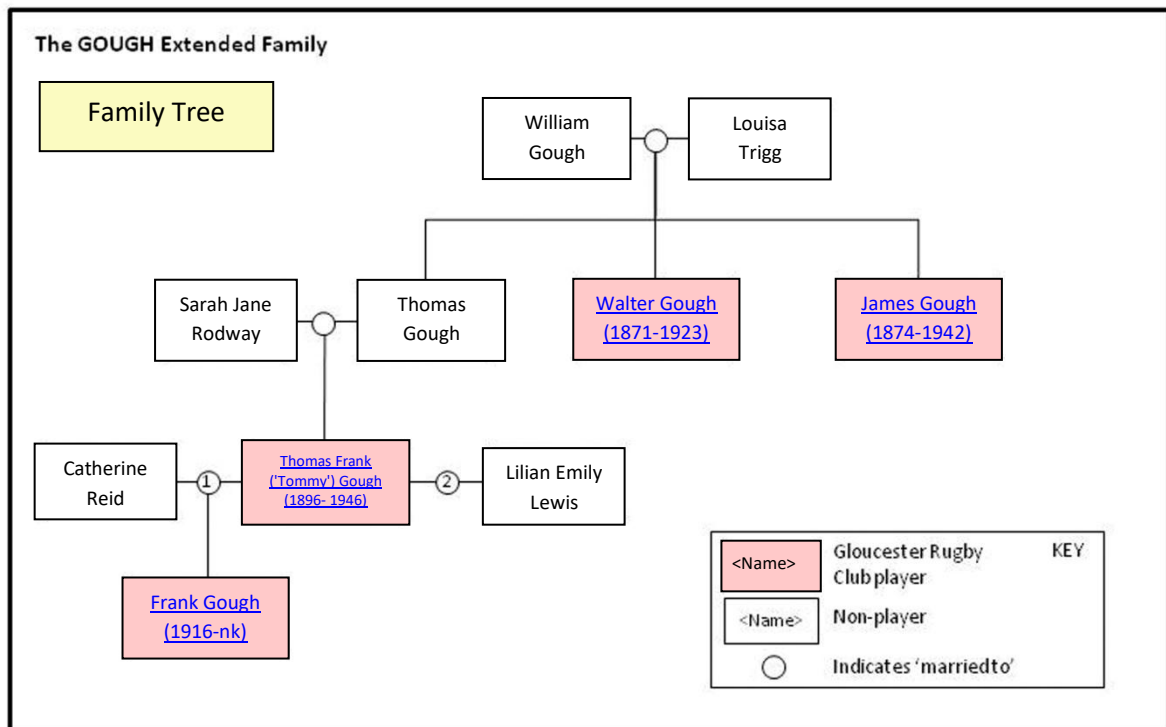


EXTENDED FAMILIES: The GOUGH Greater Family: The relationships based on marriage between the families of the brothers [Walter Gough](#) and [James Gough](#), their nephew [Thomas Frank \('Tommy'\) Gough](#) and his son [Frank Gough](#).



The **GOUGH** Family - brothers [Walter Gough](#) and [James Gough](#)

The brothers, [Walter Gough](#) and [James Gough](#), were the sons of William Gough (1838-1903) and Louisa Gough (née Trigg) (1842-1935). The couple married at Maisemore on 14 December 1862 and lived in Stroud, Gloucester and Longford. The couple had eleven children.

Walter Gough was born in 1871 at Stonehouse and initially lived at Haywards Field, Stonehouse before moving to Gloucester. Walter was the brother of [James Gough](#), the uncle of [Thomas Frank \('Tommy'\) Gough](#) and the great uncle of [Frank Gough](#). On 29 April 1899 he married Annie Christine James at Christchurch, Gorsley. The couple lived at Walham, Longford and had two children. Initially Walter was employed as a Brick Maker before he became a Fitter's Labourer at Messrs Foster Brothers, Gloucester Docks, which extracted oil from linseed and cotton seeds. **Walter as a three-quarter and full back played 51 games for the Gloucester First XV between 1891 and 1893, scoring 7 tries. After his playing career was over he acted as a referee at local junior rugby matches.** He died in Gloucester on 19 October 1923 aged 53 years. His wife, Annie, also died in Gloucester but not until 1966 age 91 years.

James Gough was born at Stonehouse on 24 May 1874 and initially lived at Haywards Field, Stonehouse before moving to Gloucester. James was the brother of [Walter Gough](#), the uncle of [Thomas Frank \('Tommy'\) Gough](#) and the great uncle of [Frank Gough](#). James, like his brother Walter, initially earned a living as a Brick Maker but by 1939 he had become a Bricklayer's Labourer. **James played in the three-quarters and as a forward and represented the Gloucester First XV on 67 occasions, scoring 6 tries.** James never married and lived with his family at Westend Parade, Gloucester and continued to live there until just before his death. He died in Cheltenham in 1962 age 88 years.

The **GOUGH** Family – father and son, [Thomas Frank \('Tommy'\) Gough](#) and [Frank Gough](#).

Thomas Frank ('Tommy') Gough was born in Gloucester on 4 February 1896, the son of Thomas Gough (1863-1927) and Sarah Jane Gough (née Rodway) (1862-1947); his parents had married at St. James Church Gloucester on 23 May 1881 and lived variously in Norfolk Street, High Orchard Street and Robinhood Street, all in Gloucester. The couple had twelve children, five of whom died in infancy. Tommy's father, Thomas, was the brother of [Walter Gough](#) and [James Gough](#) who were therefore Tommy's uncles. In 1915 Tommy married Catherine Reid (1894-1971) at West Bromwich, Staffordshire and together they had two children, one of whom, [Frank Gough](#) would also go onto play for Gloucester. However by 1921 Tommy moved in with his parents and Catherine had moved back to Lancashire where she was born and died there in 1971. Tommy by 1931 lived with Lilian ('Lily') Emily Lewis (1898-1987) who he subsequently married and with whom he had a further five children. **Tommy as a fly half played 32 games for the Gloucester First XV between 1921 and 1923, scoring 5 tries. He was awarded 3 Gloucestershire County caps.** He was also a keen boxer. Tommy died on 17 December 1946 at Gloucester age 50 years. His wife, Lilian, died in 1987 age 89 years.

Frank Gough was born at Wigan, Lancashire on 12 July 1916, the son of [Thomas Frank \('Tommy'\) Gough](#) (1896-1946) and Catherine Gough (née Reid) (1894 -1971). His grandfather, Thomas Gough, was the brother of [Walter Gough](#) and [James Gough](#), his father's uncles. He subsequently moved to Gloucester where his father now resided and earned his living as an Aircraft Store Keeper. He never married. **Frank as scrum half initially played for Gordon League before joining Lydney where he was subsequently capped to play for the county of his birth, Lancashire, in the County Championship. With success at county level he joined the Gloucester Rugby Club and played 33 games for the First XV between 1938 and 1941 scoring 4 tries.** His career with Gloucester was curtailed by the Second World War.
