






cherry pickers





During the summer months Gloucester's coach Philippe Saint-Andre has been busy looking for sharp tools for his Shed. The Cherry & Whites now boast a squad that contains seven different nationalities, including eight Frenchmen - 17 new faces in all.

Rugby League convert Jason Robinson has adapted very well indeed to the Union game with Sale Sharks, culminating with a tour with the 2001 Lions, keeping the spectators on the edge of their seats.
