

After the many changes in personnel during the close season, both on and off the field, the main message from Kingsholm was a plea for patience. Everything will take time to gel was the predominant theme.

After all, incoming Director of Rugby David Humphreys didn't take up his post until August 1st, and new Head Coach Laurie Fisher didn't arrive until after the Brumbies' Super Rugby season came to an end.

In hindsight, perhaps winning the Premiership Rugby 7s season for a second season running didn't help with the tempering of expectations!

Even then, "...judge us after the first phase of the Premiership is over..." was the Gloucester mantra, even after the heavy opening night defeat at reigning champions Northampton Saints.

Indeed, Gloucester have got steadily better. Premiership wins over Sale, London Welsh and Leicester have followed in addition to two narrow defeats against Saracens and today's opponents, the Chiefs

And the development has continued through the first two weeks of European action. A 55-0 victory over CA Brive at Kingsholm was followed by a hard fought win in France over Oyonnax.

Due to international call-ups, it will be a different looking Gloucester team this afternoon. But the LV= Cup is all about developing young talent. Both today's teams boast former LV= Breakthrough winners in Jonny May and Jack Nowell.

So, the next couple of weeks will see a number of the club's young guns get a chance to shine, individuals who have been chomping at the bit to show what they can do in the first team.

It should make for an entertaining encounter!


Both the Cherry and Whites and the Exeter Chiefs boast a serious appetite for the LV= Cup as a showpiece for the talent of their respective squads.

Team-mates of several of the Exeter Chiefs' squad in their exploits for England Unde-20s during the past two summers of success, Purdy and his Gloucester mates will be pushing their claim over the next two weeks with a trip to London Welsh after today's game at Sandy Park

January sees the LV= Cup return with Kingsholm playing host to Ospreys and Harlequins in back to back weeks and the visitors today will be looking to build on last weekend's impressive victory against Top 14 side Oyonnax before the Aviva Premiership kicks back into action against Harlequins on November 14th.
