nder new head coach Johan Ackermann, Gloucester have gone from strength to strength this season and finally look like the West Country

After last weekend's victory over Sale Sharks, the Cherry & Whites remain comfortably inside the Aviva Premiership's top four heading into the second half of the season.

Ackermann has given his charges licence to thrill in the league so far this term, with Gloucester running in plenty of sensational scores and try-of-the-season contenders already.

The former South African international got his tenure off to a flying start with an opening-day win over defending Aviva Premiership champions Exeter Chiefs, and has followed that up with notable victories over Saints, Bath, and Saracens among others

Away from their raucous home patch of Kingsholm however they have been far less prolific, with only two wins from six away matches thus far – comfortably beating Newcastle Falcons 29-7 at Kingston Park in November after edging the West Country derby against Bath 22-21 at the Rec the month previously.

But as well as playing some eyecatching rugby, Gloucester have also shown they are capable of winning ugly and grinding out a result – beating Sale 20-16 last weekend

The Cherry & Whites dug in and it was dogged defending at the death rather than expansive play that earned them a precious four points







#### RUAN ACKERMANN BACK ROW | 22 | SOUTH AFRICA A

When Johan Ackermann's first move as Gloucester's new head coach was to sign his son, it's fair to say a few eyebrows were raised.

But after 12 lung-busting appearances in the Aviva Premiership so far, Ruan has certainly proved he's in the Cherry & Whites line-up on merit alone and has been a key cog in Gloucester's rise.

A standout performer in the Lions progression to the Super Rugby final in 2017, flanker Ackermann – who also turned out for the Barbarians against Samoa at the London Stadium in 2016 – was named the Aviva Premiership Player of the Month for November.

An exceptionally fit back-rower, Ackermann has already made a whopping 149 carries this season, but has coupled that attacking ability with over a century of tackles made and he currently sits third in the league in turnovers too.

### **LEWIS LUDLOW**


BACK ROW | 23

A product of Gloucester's academy system, Lewis Ludlow is capable of playing at number eight or at six, and has been ever-dependable in the Aviva Premiership so far this season – playing every match.


After a breakthrough season last year, in which he amassed 15 league appearances and captained the Cherry & Whites in the Anglo-Welsh Cup, the 23-year-old is currently the most prolific defender in the whole of European rugby.

Ludlow has made an astonishing 202 tackles in 12 Aviva Premiership matches so far, which is streets ahead of anyone else in the English top flight and anyone else in Europe's three professional leagues.

Not only that, Ludlow is a classy lineout operator as well, alongside Jeremy Thrush, with both players inside the league's top ten in lineouts won and steals.







## HENRY TRINDER CENTRE | 28

Northampton fans will not need reminding about the threat of Gloucester's Henry Trinder, after the centre scored two tries in the Cherry & Whites' victory the last time the sides met.

The Swindon-born back, 28, has been with Gloucester since 2007 and has hit top form this season after recovering from a series of knee injuries.

He still hasn't quite managed to shake the injury problems that have plagued him, returning to action just before Christmas having missed just over a month with a knock sustained just after scoring four tries in five matches.

But his exceptional form earned him a new contract at the start of December, and after returning off the bench against both Wasps and then Sale Sharks last week, don't be surprised if the explosive midfielder lines up in the starting XV this afternoon.


#### BILLY BURNS FLY HALF | 23 | ENGLAND U20

A former England under-18s and under-20s fly-half, as well as younger brother of Bath's Freddie, Billy Burns bounced back from a serious knee injury to star for Gloucester last season

And he has continued that upward trajectory under Ruan Ackermann this season, with the 23-year-old featuring in all but one of their Premiership clashes so far.

It has been the way that he's brought the best out in his backline this term that marked him out as a fine fly-half – not just of the future, but the here and now.

Showing superb fleetness of foot Burns scored twice against London Irish last month, and he's dovetailed superbly with Billy Twelvetrees in Gloucester's winning run, with the latter taking on the goalkicking duties.
