

THE OPPOSITION GLOUCESTER



SEASON SO FAR

Today's visitors currently occupy sixth place in the Gallagher Premiership table, just one point above London Irish.

Gloucester started the season in impressive fashion, securing a 16-18 victory over Sale Sharks at the AJ Bell Stadium in Round 1.

Round 2 saw Wasps visit Kingsholm, with the Cherry and Whites continuing their form from the opening game with a 25-9 win over the Coventry-based side. Next up was a trip to Welford Road to face Leicester Tigers. In a close match, the Tigers inflicted Gloucester's first loss of the season, with the visitors coming out on the wrong side of a 16-13 scoreboard.

Premiership champions Saracens then made the journey to Kingsholm, and the visiting team secured a hard-fought 12-21 win.

December arrived and Harlequins hosted the West Country outfit at The Stoop. Quins came out on top in another highly-competitive fixture, snatching a 23-19 victory.

Gloucester got back to winning ways thanks to an emphatic 36-3 win over Worcester Warriors before a tricky trip to Franklin's Gardens ended in a 33-26 defeat to Northampton Saints.

The first Gallagher Premiership in 2020 saw Gloucester come out on top in the West Country derby over Bath, winning 29-15.
Bristol Bears defeated the Cherry and Whites 34-16 at Ashton Gate before Exeter Chiefs travelled to Kingsholm last week. The Chiefs secured the win on the road, winning 15-26.



Matt Banahan

Matt moved to Gloucester from local rivals Bath Rugby in the summer of 2018.

Matt had spent his entire senior playing career with Bath having moved there from the London Irish Academy before his move to Kingsholm.

Predominantly a winger, he is also capable of playing at centre and made in excess of 250 appearances for Bath, also winning 16 caps for England.

Banahan made a significant contribution in his first season in Cherry and White, making 24 appearances and scoring seven tries.

Ben Morgan

England international number eight Ben Morgan moved to Gloucester Rugby from Scarlets in the summer of 2012. He was born in Bristol, educated in Gloucestershire and started his rugby career with Dursley RFC.

He joined the Scarlets in May 2009 and went on to become a first team regular. He could have qualified for Wales under residency rules but opted to play for England, the country of his birth, and has gone on to win more than 30 international caps.

Now one of Gloucester's senior players, he enjoyed one of his best seasons in Cherry and White in 2018-19 and is closing in on 150 competitive appearances for the club.
