Gloucester visited the Rugby Union headquarters at Twickenham last Saturday to oppose the London Harlequins, who the previous week had defeated Bedford by 76 points to nil. The City had to field minus the services of Fred Webb (captain), who damaged his leg against Northampton, and J. Harris.

The Gloucester forwards rose to the occasion in fine style, and fairly dominated the game. Millington and Smart scored tries for the City in the first half, and Smith and Voyce converted one each. The Harlequins obtained a penalty goal in the first five minutes, but did not add to their score till towards the end of the game, when A. L. Gracie crossed after a splendid run and Wakelam converted. Gloucester thus won by 10 points to 8, and well deserved their success.

The record of the Gloucester team to date is : Played 5, won 5; points for 55, against 22.

The A team have beaten Bream, Bath A. and St. Mark's, and scored 53 points to 12.
