## GLOUCESTER OVERCOME BRISTOL

The visit of the Bristol team to Kingsholm on Saturday drew the biggest crowd this season, for it was recognised that both sides were keen on victory. Added zest was given the players inasmuch as members of the Selection Committees, both national and county, were present.

After a game full of thrills, the home team won by 2 tries (6 points) to 1 penalty goal (3 points).

Bristol were early prominent with good passing movements, which just lacked the finishing touch. Dix was ever hard at work, and Gloucester worked towards the visitors' line. From a scrum Dix secured and dashing round the line side scored wide out, the goal-kick failing.

Bristol had their revenge shortly after, Pickles kicking a penalty goal, given for obstruction.

In the second half the game was of a ding-dong character, and had both sides hard luck[*sic*]. The only score was Gloucester's second try, due to Voyce's opportunism, for from a sturdy dash through he handed on to Brown, who scored.

A draw would have been the best result, and Gloucester's good showing was again due to the magnificent play by the forwards.

To-day they will need all their skill in meeting Guy's Hospital at Kingsholm, and, owing to injuries, several alterations have been made.
