VISIT OF GUY'S HOSPITAL

GLOUCESTER'S FINE WIN

Guy's Hospital, London, paid their first visit on the Kingsholm enclosure on Saturday last and they were given a great reception by the biggest crowd of the season. The end of the game saw Gloucester victorious by 2 tries (6 points) to 1 penalty goal (3 points).

The game opened in a sensational fashion, for the city scored two tries inside a quarter of an hour. Dix was the worker for the first try. He got the ball nicely from the scrum and handed on to Thomas, who cut through and scored. The second notch was from a forward rush, when Jack Webb got the ball down. There was no further score in the first half.

For quite half of the second spell Gloucester were pressing hard on Guy's line, but the Hospital put up a desperate defence, which held out. Towards the end, Van Schalwyck dropped a fine penalty goal from nearly half-way.

Gloucester owed their victory to the magnificent work of the forwards in all departments. The home halves were better than the visitors, whilst the Gloucester three-quarters showed sterling defence and gave promise of making a fine attacking line with more play together. The Guy's men are fine exponents of the game, which they play in a very sporting spirit. To-day Gloucester journey to Cardiff, and it is to be hoped they will continue their victorious career.
